GRADE ONE

I'm a Big Kid Now!

This is your child's first taste of independence and formal learning. We explore the basics while encouraging creativity and individuality. In Judaics, children begin learning Hebrew through Tal Am, a highly successful language immersion program. The year culminates with a Siddur (prayer book) celebration. One of the lasting experiences of first grade is the Buddy Program with grade 7 students where bonds between our youngest and oldest students are created.



GRADE TWO

Yes I can!!!

Reading and writing fluency is progressing. Your child can read Hebrew script and the grade prepares for a special Torah celebration. The children also launch their first Tikkun Olam (repair of the world) project. The use of technology becomes more prominent in the educational experience as our students learn to not only express, but to create, using 21st century tools.

GRADE THREE

Who am I?

Students learn how to research and present their findings. Every child demonstrates these skills through a biographical presentation. At Passover, the students present a model seder for families--all in Hebrew!

GRADE FOUR

"If I Am Not for Myself..."

Officially part of the "upper grades," students assume more responsibility for themselves, their work, their school and their peers. In Hebrew, the children begin to express themselves in a variety of genres.

GRADE FIVE

Reading, Writing and... CIVICS

A day trip to Parliament in Victoria makes the curriculum come alive. With so many voracious readers, students post their book reviews and critiques online. Students choose an event from the Torah to creatively present for the Torah Fair. A highlight of the year is the Guest Readers series with visitors from the arts, sports and the local community.



GRADE SIX

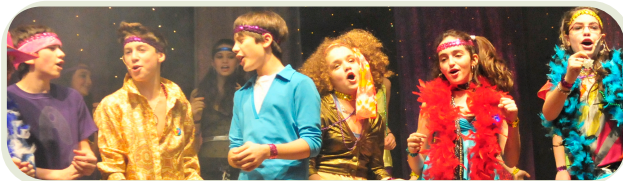
Tikkun Olam

GRADE SEVEN

Strathcona & Graduation

For so many of our students, their time at Vancouver Talmud Torah spans 10 years. They've met the challenge of a dual curriculum and have a facility in Hebrew as well as a strong sense of Jewish identity and culture. They understand their obligation to make the world a better place and have made meaningful contributions to their community and beyond through programs such as the "Mitzvah of Valuing Philanthropy" project.
