He has a Master's degree in music education from UBC, and has presented music workshops in school districts around the Lower Mainland. His book "Rhythm for Kids" is available in local music shops and online.

Eric loves getting children excited about creating music. The Garageband software application is a great tool that lets kids select musical clips, mix them, modify them and arrange them into original compositions. The program is easy to use, yet extremely versatile. Children can experiment with different styles (from hip-hop to folk), forms and effects, and burn their finished products to CD. They will learn about basic song structures and then create their own tracks using Mac computers. No formal musical training is necessary – just a love of music!
